Mark's Minnow

Forage Fish



Mark Olinger: "When the trout are munching on the young of the annual "minnow bloom" during late summer and early fall, this becomes the fly to use. A 25-inch brown and numerous rainbows fell for this fly at Tokaryk Lake, in Manitoba, during its maiden voyage. I tied the first Mark's Minnow in my pickup, while parked at Tokaryk. I had mentally created the pattern during the drive to the lake that morning."

Pattern

| Hook | 1X to 3x long nymph, sizes 6 - 10 |
|--------|---|
| Thread | Olive 3/0 Monocord |
| Tail | Olive grizzly marabou (trailing end of wing) |
| Rib | Fine gold wire |
| Body | Pearl, silver or gold Diamond Braid |
| Back | Same marabou feather as the tail, pulled forward and formed along top of body. Wound down with gold wire ribbing. |
| Hackle | Olive dyed grizzly |

Tying Instructions:

Mark's Minnow is tied the same as a Chicano. No Holographic tinsel is used and more emphasis is put on matching the color and size of the minnows extant.

Mark's Minnow is tied the same as a Chicano. No holographic tinsel is used, and more emphasis is put on matching the color and size of the baitfish extant.

- 1. Tie in tail
- 2. Tie in rib
- 3. Tie in body and wind forward, over-wrapping each previous wrap slightly
- 4. Wind rib forward
- 3. Bring wing forward and tie off
- 4. Tie in hackle by tip, make 3 wraps, tie off and finish head.
